<p><b><u>High School:</u> Food service may sell competitive foods during the service period where reimbursable meals are sold or consumed on the school campus. <p><b><u>Fundraiser:</u> The sale of food items that meet the nutrition requirements at fundraisers, are not limited in any way under the standards. The standards do not apply during non-school hours, on weekends, and at off-campus fundraising events. Foods that are not intended to be consumed at the school such as ready-to-bake cookie dough are allowed to sell for consumption after the school day.</b></p>	Fully Implemented	Campus Administrator
